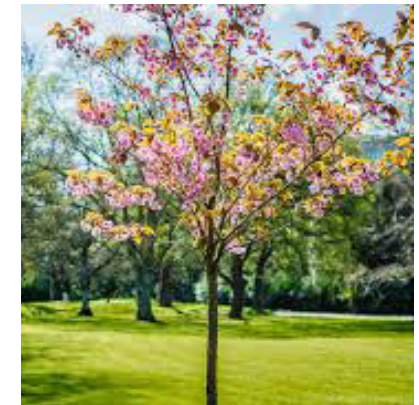

Our interns Stephen and Tim are both going on a mission trip to Sri Lanka from 6th - 17th June. They will be helping child beggars in Kandy through the organisation 'Child Action Lanka' which works to assist and transform the lives of disadvantaged children in Sri Lanka. Many of the children live and work on the streets as beggars; as such, they are often socially excluded and deprived of

opportunities and respect. Hunger, neglect, exploitation and abuse are just a few of the many challenges faced by these children everyday.

To raise funds for this mission trip Stephen and Tim are hosting an open cafe on **Saturday 21st May between 2pm - 4pm in the Church lounge** and they would really appreciate your support! Tea, coffee and cake will be available as well as more information about their mission trip. Please drop in if you can. SANDILEY CAMP

Sandiley is an 8 night camp for young people aged 10-16, based near the village of Gristhorpe, on the North Yorkshire coast. It is one of around 100 CPAS Ventures and has been going on each summer for about 50 years. Luke grew up attending this camp and speaks very highly of it and Alistair Trueman will be a leader there this year.



Activities include various games, beach trips, a day at Flamingo Land theme park, swimming and a whole range of other weird and wonderful brands of fun.
