RISEN



This excellent film 'Risen' has now been released and is being shown at Ashton Cineworld at 6.40pm next week from Monday 21st – Thursday 24th. (It may also be on beyond that date but times have not yet been released.)

The film follows the struggles of a Roman military man Clavius (Joseph Fiennes), set in his ways after serving 25

years in the army. Clavius arrives at a crossroads when he's tasked to investigate the mystery of what happened to Jesus' body following the Crucifixion. His quest to disprove the rumours of a risen Messiah makes him question his own beliefs and spirituality, and leads him on a journey he never imagined.

Far from being a cheap budget or cheesy film, Risen is a really great watch – it would be well worth taking people to see. Why not go with your small group or other friends?


HOLIDAY AT HOME

CHURCH WALK





Walk category: Blue – walk is short at approx 3 miles in length, however there are 3 short but quite steep sections (2 up, 1 down) and the terrain is uneven, parts of which include bracken. This walk is not suitable for young children and those who struggle to walk uphill and you will need waterproof clothing and walking boots.

Meet: Civic Hall car park next to St. Matthews at 1.00pm. There are a number of car parks in Uppermill which are all free of charge. The one where there is the best chance of finding a space is the long-stay car park at the Swimming Stadium, Saddleworth Leisure Centre. If there are no free spaces, there are plenty of back streets to use. For those who want to go straight to Uppermill, meet 1:45pm outside Saddleworth Museum (it looks like the building is currently being renovated).

The walk itself involves going from the village centre past quarries up to the golf course (steep climb) and coming down past Delph Donkey Line, touching the canal and onto a bridle path back into Uppermill. Walk will last approx 90 minutes, followed by a trip to the "Cellar Pot" teashop. I hope you can join us.
